- CALL TO ORDER The Dolores School Board meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. on January 14th, 2016.
- II. PLEDGE
- III. ROLL CALL Members present were: Vangi McCoy, Joye McHenry, Dee Prock, Deanna Truelsen and Linnea Vass. Scott Cooper, Superintendent, Doreen Jones, Business Manager, staff and community members were also in attendance.
- IV. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A motion was made by Vangi McCoy and seconded by Deanna Truelsen to approve the agenda with the additions.

- V. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING FOR REVIEW OR CORRECTION The January 14th, 2016, policy meeting and January 14th, 2016, regular board meeting minutes were approved as presented.
- VI. EXECUTIVE SESSION LEGAL ISSUE

A motion was made by Deanna Truelsen and seconded by Dee Prock to move into executive session for the purpose of discussion regarding legal matters as authorized by C.R.S. 24-6-402(4)(b). Those present at the outset of the executive session shall be members of the Board of Education, the Superintendent and the District's attorney.

Discussion: Ms. McHenry does not feel comfortable going into executive session to determine board member qualification. Ms. Vass said they're seeking legal counsel, therefore the communications are privileged. Ms. McHenry stated she sought CASB legal advice on her temporary move out of the Dolores district; her intent was to always maintain her seat on the board and move back within the boundaries of Dolores, and she will be doing that on Monday.

VII. CITIZENS TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

A. Operation Graduation – Jill Umberger

Ms. Umberger reported it will be at the rec center again, but the cost has increased from \$780 to \$960. There are 52 seniors this year. They would appreciate the same \$550 donation as years past.

A motion was made by Deanna Truelsen and seconded by Joye McHenry to approve the donation of \$550 to Operation Graduation.

VIII. STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

- A. Strategic Plan #1: Achievement Review Mr. Cooper reported the focus is on student achievement, interviews will take place with some staff and students on March 9th. A report will be presented to the board either in March or April.
- B. Strategic Plan #2: JEDI Just Everyone Dig In Mr. Cooper reported this is new in the secondary; the specifics are in Ms. Hufman's report. Many of the different groups have come together to join this group. They are looking at the graduation requirements and collaborating with all districts to get the best PLC plans organized. Collaboration across all districts is occurring for graduation requirements.
- C. Strategic Plan #3: The Future of School Finance Mr. Cooper attended a CASE meeting last week, the outlook isn't the best. There will be about a 1.2% cost of living increase; last year it was 2.8%. We are hitting TABOR limits. The negative factor is still an issue. A rural incentive bill is getting some traction; incentivize financially teachers who teach in rural districts. Our reserves are healthy and our community support through the Mill Levy is good and our equalization based funding. 2019-2020 is the target date to figure things out financially because of the school finance changes.

XI. BOARD REPORTS AND REQUESTS

- A. Student Government Report Ms. Umberger reported delivering to 12 families for the Thanksgiving food drive; one of the fastest deliveries, very organized. They also raised \$2,000 and took 20 kids Christmas shopping for the elementary. They're trying to organize a community service project and make it an annual event, soliciting more student involvement.
- B. BOCES Ms. McCoy reported that the meeting is next week. Mr. Cooper reported interviews are upcoming for the executive director.

- D. Legislative Network Reports Ms. McCoy reported several education bills have been introduced. State assessment costs are being looked at.
- E. Board requests for agenda items, information, etc. Ms. Truelsen asked about staff salaries, the staff that missed the increase for three years, they were only given one year. Mr. Cooper would like to at least do something for the classified staff. Minimum wage may increase this year. Ms. Prock would like salaries to be put on as an agenda item for discussion at a future meeting. Mr. Cooper reported they'd like to be able to be competitive with neighboring districts. Mr. Cooper will check into the issue regarding the cafeteria budget and pay increases, the information will be disseminated to the board.

Ms. McCoy would like to discuss the resolution regarding the collective impact initiation, Cradle to Career, agencies and school districts coming together. Ms. McCoy would like Dolores to show support for this initiation with a benign, we support this, statement. This will be put on the agenda for discussion at the next meeting. There shouldn't be a cost.

- F. Communication plan reports and discussion Ms. McCoy reported receiving concerning complaints crossing the street to the library on Highway 145. It's a safety issue. Can the town do something? The state? Ms. Vass asked if the dads volunteering at the elementary could take a sign down and help kids cross for a half an hour or so.
- G. Town Board Report Ms. Truelsen reported that maintenance of streets and snow removal was important this month. Family Dollar got their zoning and building permits. It will take them 90-120 days to complete everything, and they have their first inventory arriving in May. Truck travel and offloading has been negotiated. The new mayor and town council are elected in April.

A motion was made by Deanna Truelsen and seconded by Vangi McCoy to approve the Action Items as presented.

Discussion: Ms. McCoy asked if reimbursable travel expenses will show up on the check register. Ms. Jones reported, no, just expenses appear. Mr. Cooper, Mr. Lankford and Ms. Hufman all have travel expenses pending for attendance at meetings and seminars.

Ms. Vass asked about specifics on the donation for the concession building; Mr. Cooper reported the building is portable and can be moved if needed.

XIII. DISCUSSION AMONG BOARD MEMBERS

A. 2016-2017 Calendar – Mr. Cooper asked for staff and admin input on the current calendar and to provide feedback for planning of the new calendar. Based on feedback, they're on version six of the calendar. There were some changes, the draft calendar will be posted on the website and the community will have an opportunity to comment. A concern that came from the staff: Aligning our spring break with Cortez. Discussion ensued, and all felt it was sensible for our district to remain as we are, aligning with SCCC, as we have students that attend there. Ms. McCoy reported SCCC spring break starts March 20th, 2017.

Mr. Cooper is hoping to have a draft to present before spring break. We have to have 160 days of attendance; 1,080 hours for secondary, 6th-8th. Right now we are okay, with the snow days we've taken this year, to be in compliance with the hours of attendance. Another option is to start 5 minutes early, end 5 minutes later, and that will build in a couple more snow days if needed. There will be no staff reimbursement if this option is taken. More discussion needed on snow days, breaks, number of days of instruction, no school Fridays, etc. Any thoughts or suggestions, contact Mr. Cooper.

B. PAMS Online Payment Systems - Ms. Jones is researching this, looking at the costs. It's an opportunity for parents to pay for school lunches online. There is no cost for initial setup. Ms. Jones is going to research this further and talk with Mr. Soukup's contacts as well. Ms. Vass asked if this system will upgrade with the current system when it upgrades. All of this needs to be researched. More discussion on this at the next board meeting.
