The Dolores School Board of Education meets every second Thursday of each month at 6:00 p.m. Anyone in the community is welcome to attend the meetings. As we strive to bring Dolores School District back into the forefront of achievement, your input is important.



School Board Votes on Master Plan

Dolores School Board met on August 15, 2019, in their regular board meeting and approved the Master Plan for the new campus design created by RATIO/HPA with support from Goff Engineering and Surveying, and Jaynes Corporation of Colorado. This decision now launches the leadership into forward momentum on applying for the Building Excellent Schools Today (BEST) Grant with the Colorado Department of Education. This grant is due in January of 2020. Once the result of the application is given, next steps for the district will be determined.

Also in the meeting, the board approved their strategic plan. This plan remains in effect through this school year. See page 7 for details.

The theme this year in the elementary is "This is the greatest school!" It is founded on the ideas in the movie *The Greatest Showman* based on the life of P.T. Barnum and the beginnings of the Barnum and Bailey Circus.

Monthly Blog by Superintendent Lis Richard

Students we serve in 2019 are far different from the days when many of us sat in our school desks. Today's student communicates differently, nearly 50% come from a non-traditional family setting, have more grandparents than siblings, and have never sat at a family dinner on a nightly basis.

Think about some of the obvious differences comparing 1990's vs. 2019:

- Flatscreen TVs were very expensive and rare, so being a baller meant having a TV VCR combo in our rooms (which was usually a 13inch screen)
- If you had your own personal landline you were it! (because we didn't mind talking on the phone with each other back then)
- Headphones were the AirPods of the time!
- There was no Wiki so we had no choice but to use Encarta to do research papers. (The other option was to look things up in the encyclopedia—imagine that!)
- Obviously there were no streaming services like Netflix, therefore watching movies at home meant renting them from Blockbuster (also, going to the video store and looking around was a fun way to pass the time).
- Everyone wanted the oh-so-cool-looking iMacs (like wanting an iPhone XS Max today).
- DVD players were expensive, so only our rich friend(s) would have one. Everyone else still watched things on VCRs.
- VCRs were important because it was the only way we could record something from TV.
 (There was no Hulu, so we had to do this if we

weren't going to be home to see a new episode of something.)

- Star Wars: Episode I The Phantom Menace was the most-anticipated movie of all time (there hadn't been a new Star Wars movie in 16 years at the time).
- Wide-leg carpenter jeans and cargo pants were FASHION.
- You couldn't play video games online so we had to split screen games like Super Smash Bros.,
 GoldenEye, and Mario Kart 64 on Nintendo 64 to play against our friends.
- Using the internet meant AOL.
- Texting...what was that?
- Remember Y2K?
- If we wanted to reach someone and they weren't home then we would have to page them (cell phones were expensive and few teens had them).

This generation is called the "i-gen." They are the generation of the internet. With everything, there are positive and negative aspects. One realization is that adults are no longer the source of important information for children and teens. They are less dependent upon us and often manifest this in misunderstood ways.

Rather than fearing this generation of students, we choose to embrace them. We will focus on their individual abilities and creativities. They must have their foundational skills in place and from there, we must let them soar! We are dedicated to watching each student reach their full potential.

Academic Goal: Curriculum and Instruction

Maintain vertical alignment in English/Language Arts and add the Math alignment in accordance with the 2019 audit. This will be complete by end of the fiscal year.

Performance Goals: Academic Achievement (Student Performance)

- · Maintain District Performance Framework at or above current state ranking
- 65% of our students, K-11 show projected annual growth on NWEA testing fall to spring and the district performs above national norm in all subjects (average of all grades)
- 85% meeting end-of-year (EOY) benchmark on Reading mean in K-3
- Reaching a 90% or better graduation rate

Social/Emotional Goals: Overall Student Well-Being

- Expand the Seven Mindsets to parents and community through social media and district publications
- Expand the two-way communication with community through website feedback tabs
- Reduce recidivism and the overall referrals (conflicts) by 25% in 2019-20
- Increase number of conflicts self-resolved demonstrating student implementation of program

Financial Stability Goals: Fiscal Sustainability Over the Next Five Years

- · Maintain or increase student enrollment every year for the next five years
- Establish a plan to pursue the most important priority to increase student interest and enrollment (i.e. programs, recreation). Present plan by April 2020
- Increase the beginning fund balance for next fiscal year and establish a closer margin to balance budget between revenue and expenses for 2020-21

Facility and Maintenance Goals:

- Due to safety and security concerns for students and staff, aging facilities, and flood plane issues, make commitment in 2019 to move forward with a master plan.
- Secure a commitment or denial from the Town of Dolores Trustees to move forward on the Joe Rowell Park project in order to move the master plan to a BEST Grant.
- Through the RFP process, select the architect and contractor for the building project.
- Set a plan in place by March of 2020 for disseminating information to all stakeholders and possible bond or mill levy. Plan two Town Hall Meetings by June 2020.
- Establish a maintenance and replacement plan for the district fleet.

Preschool Adds New Infant-Toddler Playground


