We will tie in both our gymnastics and locomotor movement units putting our movement to music! SPOILER ALERT: Adorable.

K-3 are just finishing up a unit on gross motor movement and basic gymnastics and tumbling. We've had so much fun and wrapped up the unit by watching Simone Biles perform her exercise routine! The kids and I had a great discussion after about gymnasts that started out like they are learning the fundamentals when they are young and with a lot of practice, hard work, and love for the sport, look where it got her and others! Some of the students seemed inspired to set some goals with things they enjoy. Makes me feel honored to be a teacher.

4-6 grades are wrapping up our archery unit! The last range day will be soon where we finish up with a team versus team tournament/contest using the official scoring used in NASP archery tournaments! I have seen so much confidence building up in some of our students as they have become better archers. When asked what their favorite sports/activities are, I now hear back from some of them "archery!" Pretty cool stuff. Maybe some bows on the Christmas/holiday wish list this year?

6th-grade Pumpkin Drop was a huge success. We had 7 pumpkins survive this year which is the most we have ever had...so far. Our students showed lots of creativity and I am so proud of the designs.

I would like to give a special thank you to our partners Empire Electric Association (EEA) and Walmart in Cortez. EEA provided a wonderful crew and a bucket truck to help us drop the designs from the desired height of 35 feet. Walmart was also very generous and donated about 50 pumpkins for our project.

Now that the Pumpkin Drop is over, we are supporting the classroom by learning how to represent data in science fair projects. We are using Google Sheets to record, organize, calculate and chart data.

4th and 5th-grades are learning to use Google Docs to create scholarly documents.

3rd-grade is learning all about email etiquette and how to send proper emails.

2nd-grade has just finished using Google Docs to create a number square and will now begin using Google Earth to learn about latitude and longitude.

1st-grade has started to use a word processing program to type text. Students have made name signs and are now working to create sentences in MS Word.

Kindergarten will continue to work in the Waterford program all year long. Waterford is a computer-based program designed to build reading, math and science skills.
