3. Teachers will track participation each week from each student on their roster.

- a. Teachers will send in a report to their supervisor each week of student participation.
- b. Participation is based on what is assigned each day and not what is done each day. In other words, they could do more than one day's work in a day.

4. Teachers will give grades for completed work.

a. Students will have a minimum of one grade per week in each subject. Teachers may give several different assignments; however, a grade average for each subject *may* be given. There is flexibility for secondary if they are more comfortable with their current process of assessing.

b. Students will receive a participation grade each week based on working

*Expectations of Teachers:

- Elementary One live session a day (recorded and placed on Google Classroom)
- 2. Middle School 1-2 live sessions per week per course (recorded and on GC)
- 3. High School 1 live session per week per course (recorded and on GC)
- 4. Two hours of "office hours" each day for student, parent and administrative questions. Office hours will be done in Google Hangouts and teachers can be working on other items (lesson plans, emails, grading) while in the Hangout.
- 5. Contact information given to students and parents.

Expectations of Students and Parents (Guardians)

- 1. Students will make an effort to participate daily in their Google Classrooms.
- 2. Students will seek help from their teachers whenever they have difficulties.
- 3. Parents will monitor student progress and take time to learn the Google Classroom processes.
- 4. Parents will keep an open line of communication with teachers whether this is through email, phone, Google hangout, etc.
- 5. Parents and students understand that passing their grade will be dependent upon completion of work. Any student who fails more than one subject in elementary may be retained. A meeting will be held in the summer with parents, teachers, and administrators to determine placement for the fall. Secondary students who fail a semester in any class will not receive credit for that class. Teachers and administrators are available for assistance and want to see all students succeed.
