they are scared or bored. Boredom is nothing to shake a stick at. Boredom can actually be stressful to a lot of people--especially children. The #1 reason kids get into trouble and drugs is boredom! The more skilled they are at generating options and solutions to keep their feel good hormones up, and their thoughts and behavior busy with good things, the healthier they will be. Depression (not to

mention fear) will cut them off from their creativity, so it will

help to create a Pleasant Events list ahead of time. The kids will be coming home with it. Put it somewhere they can add to it. Especially activities you do together or that you discover new... remind them to add it to their
