We were excited to enjoy a small award ceremony for our 5th grade archery winners, as well, and I'll share pictures of all our State Archery Champions with their awards below!



Counselor's Corner

Hello Little Bear Families!

Listening is one of the most complicated and difficult skills we need to develop to succeed. Why is that when it seems so simple? The

kindergartners learn,
"Eyes are watching, ears
are listening, mouth is
quiet, body still." But for
children whose executive
functions are still
developing, this is so much



easier said than done. If you add genetically inherited deficits in attention or hyperactivity into the mix, let alone accidents or traumas in the child's past, it can become a gargantuan task. Our current lesson is on teaching the students that it's not their fault when listening is hard, but it is their responsibility to do what it takes to be a better listener. It will help them with friendships, teachers, and family relationships, not to mention the upcoming testing. I will be teaching them some listening tricks that will make it easier to pay attention; and we will be learning that listening involves more than what you hear, but a lot of what you see as well. One fun aspect of the lesson will be to introduce them to Morse Code. They can come home with an easy guide of how to learn Morse Code. It makes for a fun activity that will help them become intensely good listeners and they will be learning a dying skill that very few others know. Ask them about it!


