## **April Meeting Update**

The Dolores School Board met in April for their regular meeting. The items below are only highlights of the meeting. A full account may be read online on the district's website.

- Sheriff Nowlin presented to the Board. He stated that he receives the safe-to-tell reports for all schools in the county, and that since Jan 1, there have been 10 safe-to-tell reports that dealt with Dolores students. He expressed appreciation for the high level of coordination with administration and staff. Though SB 182 was not passed, Sheriff Nowlin stated that he wanted to address concerns and misconceptions that it had raised about school resource officers and student records. He stated that the concerns about incidents being reported to a student's permanent record were unfounded. The incidents are not reported to a permanent record because juveniles do not have one. Many other items were added by the Sheriff. Please see the minutes of the meeting.
- District Finance Director reported on the current state of the district in regard to finances. There are federal funds coming into the district and the board addressed some questions about this. Also, there were questions in regard to some of the many needed repairs on the facilities
- The District Accountability Committee Chair presented the results of the TLCC survey done by the staff of the district. There was a higher participation rate this year than last. The results were positive and listed the following points to consider for the future:
  - Would be helpful for district to focus on PD
  - UIP is every other year hopefully more teachers will be involved and aware next time it comes around
  - Would be helpful to further develop a mentor program for new teachers and existing staff
- Discussion ensued on the annexing into the town. The district's current campus boundaries on part of the property are outside of the town limits and falls into the county. This has been the case for over 100 years. The board is continuing research and discussion on this issue and no decisions have been made.
- The board discussed the proper use of the "Talk to the Board Tab."
- Proposition EE Funds have been given to the district. This is from the newly passed tax on vape and tobacco products. Rural districts will receive money from this for two more years.
- The recommendations to hire were all passed unanimously.

## **It Goes Both Ways**

Have you ever heard of the arm chair quarterback or a back seat driver? These are expressions that are sometimes used when someone on the sidelines or observing from the outside tries to offer their expertise into a situation. There is nothing wrong with this unless the input is only expected to be received and no dialogue is welcome.

The players in a game or the driver of the vehicle often see the opponent or the dangers on the road much better than one that doesn't have the advantage of being in the game or in the front seat.

These are analogies used to draw some thoughts for all of us to ponder. As a principal and administrator, I have done hundreds of professional evaluations and observations of employees. It has become my practice to always begin this process with good will in my heart toward the individual as well as providing them the benefit of the doubt. When the process begins, this allows me to really focus on the purpose of being in the classroom. It is to be a tool in the process of encouraging and building the very best teacher or school leaders as possible.

In education, it is our goal to see others succeed. I had the privilege of teaching in the classroom for sixteen years and never tired of seeing students succeed in my classes. If they did not succeed, I knew that there was a part that I played in that. A good teacher or evaluator wants to see their students succeed!

There are some who have a "gotcha" mentality. It they can find wrong, point out error, and expound their own knowledge or perceived understanding they feel better about themselves but fail to see that the "gotcha" mentality only demoralizes and discourages

the one they are trying to teach or help. The only "gotcha" business we should be in is the "I got you and I will help you" business.

Input in our school district is so vital. I need input from our school board and our leaders. I value input from all of our stakeholders. It is important when providing input or attempting to point out an area that may need attention, that one does so with an attitude of openness. There should be a willingness to listen to explanations and clarification.

Communication goes both ways.

So often, communication comes into the office or schools and it is anger, criticism, accusation, or simply wrong information. Many times it is delivered in a manner that is hurtful to the one receiving it. The true missing piece in this delivery is that the party transmitting in this manner will not listen or allow the teacher, principal, superintendent or other employee provide information. Communication and conflict resolution goes both ways.

I have been wrong so many times. It is often someone who works for me that comes into my office and points out something to me that needs my attention. The manner in which this is delivered definitely makes all the difference in the world. When I can ask questions and clarify meaning, it fosters change and growth in me and builds stronger relationship.

Let's work together to communicate openly. All leaders in Dolores School District are available to talk. They cherish times to clarify situations and provide information. Please do not assume one side of a situation has all of the information or perspective. Everyone has blind sides. We need each other and communication works both ways.

# FIRST GRADE ASTRONOMY UNIT


