Counselor's Corner

Hello Little Bear Families!

We have two Career Fairs coming up. On March 24th from 9 - 11:30 will be the career fair for 3rd - 5th graders. It will be in the big gym by the cafeteria. We are still in need of volunteers. If any of you would like to volunteer or if you know anyone else who might be willing, please let us know.

On April 14 from 8:30 - 11 will be our "Vehicle" Career fair for Kindergarten through 2nd grade. We also are in need of volunteers for this Fair as well. Let us know if you or anyone you know has a cool or interesting "vehicle" they use for their career.

Our Guidance lessons have been focusing on Empowerment skills as well as Refusal Skills for negative Peer Pressure. Practice tempting your kids to do something that is against your/their moral values. They should follow these steps in response to you:

- 1. Name the wrong
- 2. Name the consequence
- 3. Name an alternative activity (something ELSE that is BEST to do)
- 4. Say No. (They can say as they walk away, "I hope you change your mind!")
- 5. Is it a Safety issue? Say No. Then Go Report .(Younger students say No and Go Tell.)

Example: 1. That's stealing. 2. We'll get in trouble. 3. Let's go to my house and make cookies instead. If you're still being pressed to steal... 4. Say No. I hope you change your mind. If it is an issue of safety: 5. Say "No. I have to go home now." Then report to a trusted adult right away.

Make sure your children know NOT to explain their reasons for refusing. Make sure they DON'T "Preach" to you or tell you you "shouldn't" do it or why. And finally make sure they report in private. This will help them overcome their fear of refusing because they are not giving the perpetrator anything that could be interpreted as a put down. It helps them stay safe as well.


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
IMPORTANT!

Dear Parents,

Montezuma County Smile Makers Dental Program will be offering preventive dental services for Dolores Schools. The dental services will be delivered at the Four Corners Youth Clinics location. Dates will be April 20-21 and April 27-28, 2022.

Preventive services will be offered to all children with a signed consent form (provided below). If your child has been seen by a Dentist or Hygienist in the last 6 months, he/she may not need this service.

MCSM accepts children's Medicaid and CHP+ (delta dental), as well as cash payments. If your child has Medicaid or CHP+, there is no cost to you if it has been over 6 months since last cleaning. If your child does not have Medicaid or CHP+, you may pay with cash or check. (MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO MCSM) Please see price chart below.

PREVENTATIVE SERVICES

- Dental screening/Oral hygiene instructions by a registered Hygienist (Donated by MCSM)
- Prophylaxis (cleaning) \$35
 UNDER 12YRS \$45 OVER 12YRS
- X-RAYS (BITE WINGS) \$25 UNDER 12YRS \$35 OVER 12YRS
- Fluoride Varnish \$25
- Sealants (as needed) \$35 per sealant
- Referrals to a Dentist (If decay/cavities or other concerns are evident)

Dental sealants are thin, plastic coatings painted on the chewing surfaces of the back

It is recommended that children receive sealants on their permanent molars as soon as the teeth come in. If your child is between 5-7 years old, or between 11-14 years old, he/she may be eligible to have sealants placed on their 6 or 12 year molars.

Results of screening will be sent home with your child the day of the services. If you have any further questions or would like to schedule a restorative appointment we can be reached at 970-564-4764.
