

Kindergarten is starting a new math unit on 2 dimensional shapes.

Students are beginning to read and discuss classic stories.

Mrs. Jaburg's Class just finished up with their 5 senses exploration. They used pumpkins and were able to feel the outside and inside. They were able to taste pumpkin pie in a cup and a parent brought in pumpkin muffins to try!

Mrs. Lindsay's class finished their 5 senses exploration as well. They did this with applesauce. The students had a great time on their fall walk. They are also blending sounds into words and recognizing whole words.

First grade has wrapped up the first quarter with lots of learning under our belts. So much to explore and learn! We have been reading stories in a chapter book called Snap Shots, as well as working on reading and spelling short vowel word patterns and tricky spelling words. COPS helps us check our writing for Capitalization of Names, the word I, and beginnings of sentences; Organization of making sense as we write; Punctuation using periods, exclamation marks, and question marks; and checking our Spaces between words and Spelling all the sounds of our words. We have been writing short personal narratives in our journals. While practicing all things counting to 100+ in math, we have also built strategies in problem solving with addition to the sums of 10. Recognizing quantities and patterns of quantities, using tools like many tools, has built our understanding of numbers and their relationships. We love learning about science! First, it was Astronomy and the study of space, our solar system, and astronauts. Then, it was an exploration and study of Geology about our earth's land and water, volcanoes, rocks and minerals, and finally dinosaurs with fun activities of making geodes, excavating dinosaur bones, and a field trip to the river! Now, we will begin an in-depth study of Biology and the human body systems, nutrition, and healthy activities. We are learners to our core!

("I WAS HOPING WE COULD WORK ON DEVELOPING OUR OWN VIDEO GAME"). #4. SAY NO. REPORT. ("IT'S OKAY. I'M NOT GOING TO DO THAT. I HOPE YOU CHANGE YOUR MIND AND COME OVER."). IT'S IMPORTANT THAT THEY REPORT IN PRIVATE AND DON'T ANNOUNCE THEIR PLAN. THIS KEEPS THEM SAFE AND ISN'T AS SCARY AS SIMPLY SAYING NO.

COUNSFLOR'S CORNER: MRS. MILLER

WE HAVE BEEN PRACTICING HOW TO RESPOND "SOFTLY" TO AGGRESSION, WHETHER IT IS MEAN WORDS OR ACTIONS (NOT PHYSICAL AGGRESSION THAT CAUSES PAIN, WHICH IS A SAFE SCHOOL VIOLATION AND NEEDS TO OF COURSE BE REPORTED IMMEDIATELY). BY SOFT I DO NOT MEAN QUIET OR WEAK. BUT TO RESPOND IN SUCH A WAY THAT MANAGES THE AGGRESSIVE PERSON AND KEEPS THEM FROM ESCALATING FURTHER. BEGINNING WITH "IT'S OKAY" OR "I'M SORRY" IS NOT ADMITTING FAULT, BUT INSTEAD SIGNALS TO THE AGGRESSOR THAT THIS IS NOT A BULLY-BACK, OR RETALIATION. THE KIDS HAVE EVERY RIGHT TO ASK THEM TO PLEASE STOP OR TO TELL THEM WHAT THEY ARE DOING WRONG, BUT WE HAD THEM RATE THOSE TYPE OF RESPONSES: DID THEY FEEL IT WOULD GET BETTER OR WORSE AND INVARIABLY, THEY INSTINCTIVELY KNOW IT WILL MOST LIKELY GET WORSE. CHECK OUT MY HANDOUT ON HOW TO HANDLE BULLYING. ON THE BACK SIDE ARE LOTS OF IDEAS OF HOW TO RESPOND TO PUT DOWNS IN A SOFTER, MORE PRODUCTIVE WAY. THE KIDS NEED HELP PRACTICING AND IT HELPS THEM FEEL EMPOWERED.
