


KINDERGARTEN MRS. JABURG. MRS. PEJSA


4TH GRADE MRS. COPENHAVER, MRS. LINDSAY. MRS. SCHRAGE

Greetings!

We here in 5th grade are ready for another outstanding school year! We have enjoyed getting to know our students over the past couple of weeks and are excited to continue working with them! This year, we are trying something new in 5th grade - each of the 3 teachers will have their own specialization (Mr Werner will teach math, Mrs. Thornbrugh will teach Language Arts / Reading, and Mr. Krumwiede will teach Science / Social Studies). We will try to do most of our communication with parents on Class Dojo, so if you have questions about your child's performance in a specific topic, send a DM to the corresponding teacher.

In Math, we are starting the year studying various methods of multiplication and division, as well as geometry topics such as perimeter, area and volume. Please try and make time each week to help your child study their math facts, particularly times tables 0-12. Students each have a set of flash cards and are aware of some online resources that can help develop these skills. In Language Arts, we are learning about personal narratives. Students have begun to write a personal story about a happy memory they have. We have also been focusing on adjectives and verbs. On Monday, the 19th, the students' first spelling list will come home. Please help your child study in the evenings.

In Science, we are conducting experiments and investigating the matter all around us. There will also be an opportunity for your students to complete their first science project of 5th grade, which will involve them creating and presenting their very own chemical change/reaction. More exciting details to follow! Social sStudies in the first quarter will be focused on maps, world lakes, and the geography of the United States. They will also be required to learn the location of all 50 states on a map, as well as each state's capital city. Please let us know if you have any questions, comments, or concerns. 

Welcome back to PE Little Bears-I am looking forward to a year filled with movement, skills work, and nutrition studies all through the use of games and activities! Our overall PE curriculum is based on the Five Components of Fitness: muscular strength, muscular endurance, cardio-respiratory endurance, flexibility, and body composition. Not only are these concepts part of our Colorado State Physical Education Standards, but I figure if kids get in the habit of working all five of these concepts into their lives in fun ways, we'll be seeing some pretty healthy and happy adults someday! Grades K-2 will start their year out learning and improving their "locomotor movements" (any movement that gets you from here to there) through many engaging games. These are the building blocks to so many skills in the future. Grades 3-5 start their beginning of the year (BOY) fitness testing and goal setting for the end of the year (EOY) testing in April. Third grade learns how to test while 4-5 officially tests and records results. The goal is always to improve your own scores by the end of the year. (a personal record or "PR") Our tests are the PACER cardio respiratory run, Curl-Ups abdominal endurance test, and the Sit and Reach flexibility test.
