#### Hello All.

April is flying by so fast! This month my lessons were on respect and responsibility.

In kindergarten we read the book The Little Spot of Responsibility- A Story about Good Decision Making. We talked about three questions we can ask ourselves to help us make responsible decisions, they are: Is it safe? Is it respectful? Is it kind? We had a group discussion using a variety of scenarios and then decided what would be the responsible decision.

In 1st and 2nd grade we read A Little Spot of Respect- A Story about Respecting People, Places and Things. We wrote about different ways we can show respect to the people around us, the places we visit and the things we use.

In 3rd grade we read The Little Spot of Responsibility- A Story about Good Decision Making. We learned how to use decision charts to make the best decision. The decision charts examine positive and negative consequences and how ourselves and others are impacted by the decisions we make. We also talked about the importance of reflecting on our decisions as a learning experience.

In 4th and 5th grade we talked about responsible decision making. We watched a short video and discussed a case scenario. We took a decision making assessment and used the results to reflect on our strengths and weaknesses in decision making. We talked about thinking through positive and negative consequences and how our decisions impact ourselves and others.

For our last lesson of the year we will be talking about Optimism.

Spring is here and our kindergarteners are enjoying the warm weather. We are currently learning about Taking Care of Our Earth and have, or will go, on a walk to pick up trash around our school/neighborhood. The kids are learning about recycling and how to conserve our natural resources. Our youngest students CAN make a big difference.

In reading, we continue to learn new "tricky" words. These are words with letters that don't always do what they are supposed to. We also continue to work on sounding out more and more challenging words. We work with double consonants, blends, digraphs and more. We also read many decodable stories on a daily basis.

In math, we just reviewed our 2D and 3D shapes. Currently, we are working on teen numbers and seeing them as 10 ones and more ones. This gives the kids a foundation in place value for next year. We also continue to write daily. We focus on letter formation, nice handwriting, and sentence structure. Our students are doing a wonderful job and have done many independent writing assignments. We are excited for the many things still to come over the next several weeks!

# <u>IST GRADE</u> MRS. MYERS, MRS. TOURJEE, MRS. WHITE

First grade is welcoming in the springtime with tons of games and fun! In math we are learning about defining and non defining attributes to a 2D and 3D shape. This involves a TON of hands on learning and exploring with all of our different shapes. The students have been enjoying this unit and taking it into the real world with them. For knowledge, we are learning all there is to know about all of the different kinds of animal habitats. For each habitat, we fill in our habitat journal, so we are able to then go through our journal at the end of the unit and choose an animal habitat the students want to learn more about. Since it is April, we are also writing Earth Day promises. These are promises we make to one another and to the Earth that explain how we can do our part to take care of our Earth. As always, read, read, read! We have seen SO much growth in the students' literacy skills, so all of the hard work is paying off! Take a book outside and enjoy the sunshine as an added bonus! 












### 2ND GRADE MRS. LEIN. MRS. WADE

We are above and beyond proud of our second-grade historians! They did a fantastic job with their Wax Museum presentations. We are very grateful for your support at home with helping our students memorize their speech and their costumes were top notch!

We are beginning a new unit on "Cycles in Nature" to learn about the many natural cycles that make life on our planet possible, including seasonal cycles, cycles of flowering plants and trees, and animal life cycles. We will learn about the water cycle for living things and the importance of conservation as we depend on a limited fresh water supply.

We have also started a new unit in math that focuses on geometry and fractions. Students are learning about characteristics of polygons, partitioning shapes into equal parts, identifying fractions, and starting to investigate arrays which will help them with multiplication and division.

We are continuing an in-depth study of the "War of 1812" in our CKLA reader and continuing to word on word analysis skills, syllabication, and phrasing to help with decoding and fluency. Sharing in your child's reading at home has helped with their growth as independent readers - thank you!




## 3RD GRADE MRS. CHRISTENSON, MRS. WERNER

April has been a busy month as we balance state testing preparations and continue learning. First, students are learning about ecology which includes information such as food chains with consumers, producers, and decomposers and how environmental changes affect animals and plants. On Tuesday, we'll take a trip to the Dolores Public Library for a lesson and activity on animal adaptations. Secon, this month's book report project is a shoe box diorama. Students will create a 3D scene from their chapter book and write a description. Some students are able to complete this in class and others will be working on it at home. Finally, Ask your child about a new math game called Garbage! or Trash! that helps build multiplication fluency. You can easily make this game at home with some index cards. Greetings Parents,

We cannot believe it's already the 4th Quarter at Dolores Elementary! The following is a quick snapshot of the happenings here in 5th grade.

In Math, we have been reviewing 5th grade skills in preparation for CMAS and NWEA testing, which will take place over the next couple of weeks. We just wrapped up our unit on fraction operations and will be working on some geometry skills over the last quarter in preparation for middle school next year. Continue supporting your students if they are not all the way fluent in their times and division tables as this will be a huge expectation next year!

In Language Arts, we have been reviewing the elements of Plot, which include setting, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution. We have also focused on character traits, and how the progression of the story can change a character's traits. Just a reminder, we have one more book report! Students will need a cereal box. This project is due April 30th!

In Science we just finished up our unit on Protecting Earth's Resources through conservation and being great stewards for the planet. Next we dive into space and will explore the moon, stars, and planets of our solar system with our Astronomy unit. This will include a fun "Planet Walk" with the class along the Dolores River.

In Social Studies your students have just finished up a unit on the Westward Expansion Before the Civil War, which will lead us into our last unit on the Civil War. It will cover the timeline and events that surrounded and led up to the war between the Union and the Confederacy. They will have then been introduced to the history of the United States, from the very first steps of settlers on the land, through the war that ended slavery and shaped the country as we know it.



Each grade level has just finished up their latest projects. Kindergarten students studied the later work of Pablo Picasso and created cubist portraits emphasizing geometric shapes and bold colors. First graders combined the concept of symmetry and the painting style of pointillism to make colorful butterflies. Second grade analyzed Vincent Van Gogh's "Starry Night" and recreated their own version of the painting focusing on movement and texture. Third graders used Amate Mexican Bark paintings as their inspiration to paint fanciful images of birds and plants on crumpled brown paper. 4th grade students have practiced a variety of watercolor techniques and used their newfound skills to create watercolor paintings of animals. Fifth graders learned how to use the vanishing point to create a 1 point perspective drawing.
