

Our pick-up and drop-off will look very different in August. Please watch for announcements about traffic patterns in this newsletter, the district website, and other publications.


As we look ahead to summer, we remain committed to providing enriching opportunities for our students, including our summer learning programs and facility improvements that will enhance our learning environments for years to come.



May is a very busy and exciting time of year as we wrap up the school year. It's a time filled with energy, celebration, and a strong focus to end on a high note with positive behaviors and enthusiasm!



Two Dolores Middle School students, Tristan Rime and Kyler Shoopman, proudly represented our district in this year's Colorado Blue Spruce Young Adult Book Award—a statewide competition where student judges select the top young adult novel of the year.







Dolores has participated in the Blue Spruce program for the past three years and remains the only team representing Southwest Colorado. Tristan and Kyler committed to weekly meetings, joined state-wide Zoom discussions, read at least four of the nominated books, and collaborated with other student teams across the state to help determine the winner.

This year, 59 student judges cast their votes for the official Blue Spruce Award. Additionally, 501 students from 18 Colorado schools and public libraries participated in selecting the Readers' Choice Award.

As 24-25 wraps up, a look forward to the year to come...

It's hard to believe another year has come and gone! Before we transition to summer living, I want to share with you information, updates, and exciting things to look forward to in the next school year.

As a staff, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our practices, make learning and education more meaningful for our students, and to prepare students (and their parents!) for life after high school. This means that change is inevitable, and that new initiatives are bound to roll out.

As we look into the 2025-2026 school year, it is my hope that our community will continue to rally together to support what is best for students. It takes a village, and we sure have a great one!

#### SUMMER SCHOOL

There are three reasons students can/should attend summer school.

- Credit Recovery
- To make up attendance seat time
- Voluntary interest (student financial responsibility \$225)
- College credits (student has full financial responsibility)

For all students wishing or needing to take summer school, please request your course by <u>filling out this form</u>, <u>ASAP</u>. Registration begins May 5<sup>th</sup>, and many classes fill.

Additionally, students will attend a summer school orientation during the school day on May 14<sup>th</sup>, and will need to complete the <u>online learning agreement</u>. For more information, please reference the summer school board by the front office. Students who are recommended summer school for credit reasons will receive a letter with specific information via USPS this week!

# **Dolores High School Advising (continued)**



### ICAP Implementation

Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, CDE will require all schools to submit their ICAP plans as part of the state reporting process.

Districts have been provided with middle and high school standards, that are being used to develop our plan and seminar curriculums (see below for more info.)

Once finalized this summer, the plan and grade level checklists will be made available to all students and parents.

From the CDE website:

"ICAP is a multi-year process that intentionally guides students and families in the exploration of career, academic and postsecondary opportunities.

With the support of adults, students develop the awareness, knowledge, attitudes, and skills to create their own meaningful and powerful pathways to Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness (PWR)."



### Advisory/Seminar

Beginning this fall, students will attend a shortened period, grade level specific seminar each day. Our ICAP curriculum team will be working through the summer to complete lesson planning to make this content relevant and meaningful for our 6-12 grade students.

Middle school students will continue with Bear Time, implementing the new ICAP curriculum. For high school, Seminars will be a .25 credit, grade bearing course each semester, beginning with freshman seminar, and culminating with senior seminar. Seminar advisors will maintain the same students throughout high school, providing a homeroom environment for each student.



### **ICAP Meetings**

Each year, HS students will meet with the Academic Advisor to review and update their 4-year plans and track credit progress toward graduation.

During these meetings, discussions will take place around interests, strengths, and skills in an effort to identify and develop potential academic and career goals for after high school, and the courses, opportunities, and tasks to help them accomplish those goals.

Parents are always invited to attend these meetings, and a calendar invite will go out to students and parents to sign up for a time slot about a month before grade level meetings take place.
