Building for Our Future



Students in grades 6-8 must power off and store personal devices in lockers or backpacks upon arriving at school.



Health and Wellness (continued)

Important Health Reminders for a Healthy School Year

- Immunizations: Please ensure your child's immunizations are up-to-date.
 School-required Vaccines
- **Exemptions:** Nonmedical exemptions must be submitted each year. Vaccine Exemptions
- Medication at School: If your child requires medication during school hours (prescription or over-the-counter), please remember that all medications must be on file in the health office with proper physician orders and parent/guardian consent forms. Students are not permitted to carry medication on their person, with the exception of emergency medications like inhalers, which also require specific paperwork.
- Emergency action plans: Students with asthma, diabetes or life threatening allergies must have an EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN with doctor's orders on file with the nurse each year at the start of school. We need to have the most current information and action plans in place to ensure their safety and well-being.
- How sick is too sick?: Please keep your child home if they are
 experiencing symptoms of illness such as cough, fever (100.4°F or higher),
 vomiting, diarrhea, or a new, unexplained rash. They should be fever-free
 for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication before returning
 to school. How Sick is too Sick?

A Note on Handwashing and Hygiene

With cold and flu season just around the corner, good hand hygiene remains one of our best defenses. We'll be reinforcing proper handwashing techniques at school, and I encourage you to do the same at home. Covering coughs and sneezes with an elbow or tissue is also crucial!
