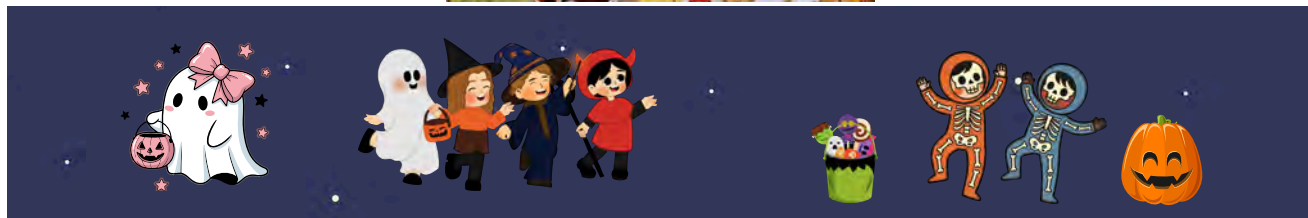

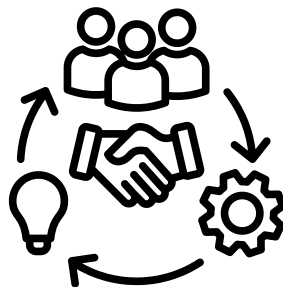

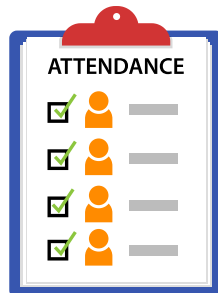

Red Ribbon Week – Celebrating Healthy Choices at Our Middle School ♥

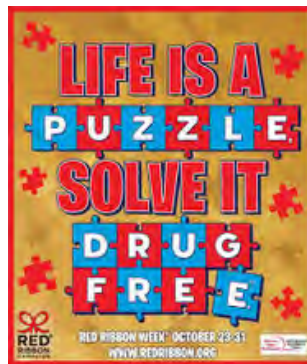

October is National Bullying Prevention Month.

When children experience difficulties in their social interactions, the behaviour is often quickly labelled as bullying. This assumption is made not only by children themselves but also by adults. The term bullying is widely used in many contexts, from schools to workplaces, and children in particular apply it often. However, in my conversations with them, I find that genuine bullying is actually less common than it seems.

That's why it's important to clearly distinguish between different types of negative or concerning behaviour among children. By doing so, educators, parents, and caregivers can respond in ways that are both accurate and effective.

September was a busy month at DHS, and we have plenty to celebrate. Students took the NWEA MAP test, which measures how they're doing compared to other students across the country. This year, 73% of our students scored in the average to above-average range. That is a step up from 66% two years ago. We're also seeing better attendance and stronger focus in the classroom.

Our staff has worked hard to stay steady and committed to teaching, and that effort is showing in the results.

Activities are off to a strong start as well. Volleyball, football, cross country, Knowledge Bowl, FFA, cheer, drama, and band have all been busy. As September wraps up, competition will pick up, and students will be preparing for contests and auditions. Of course, Homecoming is right around the corner. It's one of those weeks that students will remember long after high school. Looking ahead to October, many of our teams will be recognizing Cancer Awareness Month, acknowledging the impact it has had on families while also promoting the importance of health checkups.

We are also highlighting Bullying Prevention this month. Our policy, like many others across the state, is built around educating students and addressing bullying directly. Not every report fits the textbook definition of bullying, but they all have something in common, respect is missing. Life can be tough, and we want our students to develop the resilience they'll need to face challenges. At the same time, as a school and a community, we can make that road easier by focusing on each other's strengths instead of perceived weaknesses. Parents have an important role in this too, guiding kids as they learn how to make decisions and manage their impulses.

When I look back at September, what stands out most is growth—academic growth, growth in activities, and growth in character. That doesn't happen without teamwork between our students, staff, parents, and community. Thank you for being part of it, and I'm excited to see what we can accomplish together as we move into October.

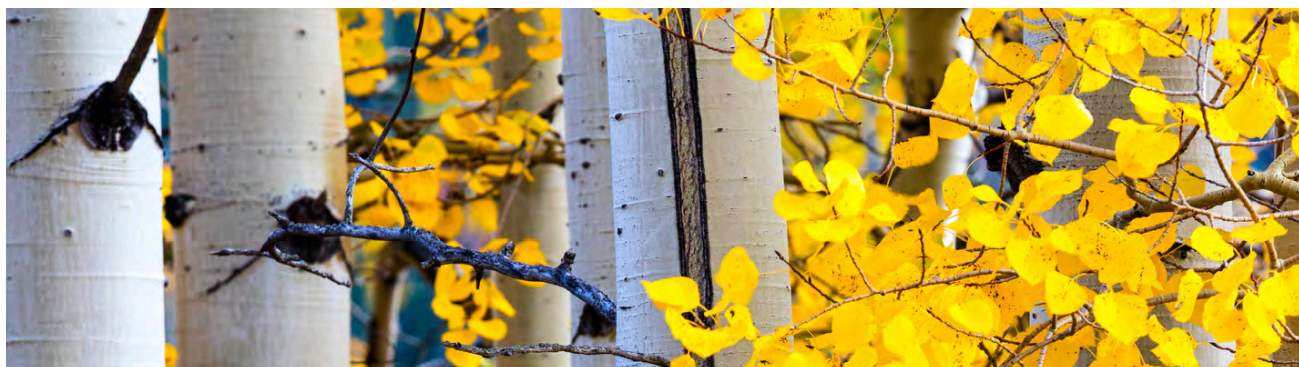

- [How Sick is too Sick?](#) Please keep your child home if they are experiencing symptoms of illness such as cough, fever (100.4°F or higher), vomiting, diarrhea, or a new, unexplained rash. They should be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication before returning to school.
