## Student Safety Initiative: Wednesday Library Bus Service

Student safety is always our top priority, and we're excited to announce a new service that provides safe transportation and enriching after-school opportunities for our students.

Starting this month, the Dolores School District will provide bus drop-off service to the Dolores Public Library on Wednesdays.

This initiative emerged from conversations with families and town officials about transportation challenges and our commitment to ensuring that all students have safe after-school options. We recognized that some students need alternative transportation arrangements, and the library provides a secure supervised, enriching environment.

### **How It Works:**

- Every Wednesday after school dismissal
- Students need to have a signed Transportation Code of Conduct before riding the bus
- The bus will transport students directly to the Dolores Public Library
- Students can be picked up by families at the library
- · Library staff will be aware of student arrivals
- · Service is available to all students who need it

### How to Use This Service:

Parents who would like their children to use the Wednesday library bus service should:

- 1. Contact your child's school office to register
- 2. Complete a Code of Conduct form Bus Code of Conduct
- 3. Discuss the plan with your child
- 4. Arrange a pickup time at the library

We encourage families to take advantage of this opportunity, especially on days when transportation may be challenging or when students could benefit from additional study time and library resources. We may provide additional transportation on other days if our students need it.

### **Construction Updates**

Our building improvement projects are progressing well. We appreciate the community's ongoing patience as we navigate temporary adjustments to traffic patterns and campus access.

Take a look at our new Information Signs. It may take some time for our staff to navigate the latest messaging, but we are very excited to have up-to-date signage for our community.

### **NAEYC** Evaluation

NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) made their appearance last month for our site visit. We have been waiting several months for this visit. The assessor flew in from New Hampshire. The site visit is an in-person evaluation of our program's quality. The assessor observes classrooms and evaluates evidence against over 400 criteria. The results will be released in 1-3 months. We are keeping our fingers crossed. If we achieve accreditation again this year, it will make 15 years that we have been honored with this distinction.


## **Family Meal Event**



Ed Miller had another piece published, In the Shadow of Eagles, and our shop teachers, Jonas Weiss and Tyson Atwell, spent

time training high school teachers from all across Southwest Colorado. We're lucky to have such a talented crew here at DHS.

Homecoming Week was a big hit. The school spirit from our students, staff, and families was incredible, and we can't wait to build on that energy next year. We also hosted the annual Halloween Carnival on the elementary playground, and it was a blast with lots of smiles, costumes, and fun for everyone who came out.

Our Boys Cross Country team made it to State this year, along with our standout female runner, Emilynn Hill. Joseph Padilla placed 27th overall, earning All-State honors and helping the boys team take 11th place. Rounding out the team were Bodie Fischer, Orin Samulski, Nathan Gaddis, Corvin Smith (58th), and Owen Lowe (57th). Emilynn ran her best time yet in the 5K, finishing in the top 50 and earning All-State honors of her own. What an awesome showing all around!

Our Volleyball team finished the regular season with an impressive 22–1 record, avenging their only loss in three straight sets. They'll host the regional round-robin tournament here in Dolores, with the winner moving on to State – go Bears!

Around fifteen of our students have tried out or will soon audition for All-State Choir and Band, and our Cheerleaders are gearing up for regional competition this month. Several of our students took the UNC Math qualifying test, a statewide competition, preliminary results show DHS having five students qualify for the in-person state competition this spring. We are excited to see how they do!

•Football wrapped up its season against Norwood, and for the first time since •2010, Dolores Football finished with at least half their games in the win •column. That's a big step forward for the program and something to celebrate. All of the successes, challenges, and growth are reasons to be thankful for our Dolores community moving into the Holiday Season.

- **Football**: The Bears celebrated their best season in over a decade, winning their first league game and finishing with a .500 record—the first time in 12 years! The team played tough, competitive football all season long.
- **Volleyball**: With only one loss all season, the girls' volleyball team is currently ranked third in the state and will be hosting regionals. The Bears have shown dominance on the court and are ready to make a strong run in the state tournament. Go Bears!
